Dr. S. Rame Gowda, Chairman, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) welcomed the members of the newly reconstituted Council. He on behalf of the Council congratulated Dr. Abdul Kalam, Chairman, All India Board of Technician Education of AICTE on his getting the conferment of the highest Civilian Award of Bharat Ratna by the President, Government of India.

He briefed the members about the steps being taken to revamp the technician education under the guidance of Dr. Abdul Kalam. Council members were also informed about the launching of Early Faculty Induction Programme as one of the steps taken by AICTE to attract bright young persons to teaching career in technical institutions which are experiencing serious shortage of faculty.

The Chairman mentioned that AICTE has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with National Informatics Centre (NIC) for connecting AICTE, its Regional Offices and technical institutions through VSATs. AICTE has planned to broadcast technical education programmes through Doordarshan for which Prasar Bharati had allocated 7, half an hour slots on DD1 and DD2. The Chairman also expressed the need for the development of technical education for the benefit of weaker sections of the society and the handicapped persons. He emphasised the need for more financial support from the Government so that AICTE may fulfill the mandates given by the parliament more effectively.

Shri P.R. Dasgupta, Education Secretary, Ministry Human Resource Development (MHRD) gave a brief account of the concern

of Dr. Murali Manohar Joshi, Hon'ble Minister of HRD, for the quality growth of technical education in the Country. He indicated that the budgetary allocations to higher education shall be increased substantially and technical education would get its due share. He conveyed the concern of the Hon'ble Minister on the declining of Standards of technical education and hoped that AICTE which is a powerful instrument of the Country, would play important role to bring excellence in technical education. AICTE should have due consultations with the stake holders including the State Governments while fulfilling its mandate to strengthen technical education. The Council should be the fulcrum for promoting excellence. AICTE should be able to control the 'fly-by-the-night operators' but at the same time genuine parties should be given due encouragement.

The members congratulated the Council for various initiatives taken by AICTE to strengthen the technical education system in the Country. A number of useful suggestions were given including participation of industry in technical education, expansion of facilities for technical education in North Eastern States, training of teaching faculty, more emphasis on Research and Development, evolving of national guidelines for opening new technical institutions, issue of regulations by AICTE/Government of India to prevent out the entry of 'fly by the night operators', planning strategies to increase the ratio of technicians to engineers above the present level, improvement of teaching and learning processes including feed back mechanisms

from class rooms, acceptability of Indian degrees globally, regular updation of model curricula and revamping of the functions of the Regional Committees.
