### CIRCULAR

To,

All the Directors/ Principal of AICTE Approved Institutions.

**Subject:- Celebrations of the "Constitutions Day" on 26<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2019 and subsequent activities culminating in "Dr. Ambedkar Jayanti " on 14<sup>th</sup> April, 2020..**

Dear Sir/ Madam,

The 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Indian Constitution is proposed to be celebrated throughout the year starting from 26<sup>th</sup> November, 2019. This programme is to focus on fundamental duties and ensure that every citizen follows them systematically. The main strategy is to run it as a mass movement rather than a government scheme allowing participation of one and all.

You are requested to plan the following activities in your institution:-

- 1) Pledge on Fundamental Duties:-** A Pledge based on Preamble of the Constitution and on Fundamental duties is to be administered to one and all in the institution.
- 2) Spreading awareness about the Constitution and Fundamental Duties:-** Institutions may organise talks about the importance of the Indian Constitution and spread awareness about the fundamental duties.
- 3) Live telecast of the Parliament Session on 26.11.2019:-** Necessary arrangement may be made for watching the live program from the Central Hall of Parliament and ensure that the program is seen by all students preferably in a central location.
- 4) Organization of Competitions:-** The Institution should conduct debate and Essay Writing competitions and student's participation to the maximum extent should be encouraged during year long events and call for registration for this competition be released on 26.11.2019. Online registration of the students for the same be ensured.
- 5) Mock Parliament:-** The Institution should conduct mock parliament competition for students and winning team should be suitably rewarded.

Activities wise details may be furnished to AICTE in this regard. Communication received from MHRD is also attached for further necessary action.

**Action Plan for Celebration of the "Constitution Day":**

**1) Spreading awareness about the Constitution and Fundamental Duties**

Every Law college may be asked to identify (10) colleges/high education institutions located nearby and organise talks about the importance of the Indian Constitution and to spread awareness about the Fundamental Duties. UGC may coordinate with all the affiliating Universities to call for a meeting of the law colleges and prepare a detailed programme for this purpose. UGC may also ensure that the programme is properly monitored. Since there are about 1200 law colleges and it is expected that more than 10,000 higher educational institutions should be covered under this part of the campaign.

**2) Live telecast of the Parliament Session on 26.11.2019**

All the higher educational institutions may be asked to make arrangements for watching the live programme from the Central Hall of Parliament to commemorate the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Indian Constitution. It must be ensured that the programme is seen by as many students as possible, preferably in a central location.

**3) Participation of one lakh students in the competitions.**

UGC has already proposed a date-wise action plan for conducting Debate and Essay Writing competitions at City, State and national level pertaining to Fundamental Duties of the Indian Constitution. It must be ensured that the call for registering for this competition is released on 26.11.2019 and online registration of the students is facilitated. All the Regional Offices of the UGC and AICTE should work together to get at least 1 lakh student participation in these competitions. Further, there should be a clear timeline along with persons responsible for organising these events. The online portal for registration of students may be launched on 26.11.2019.

**4) Mock Parliament.**

All higher education institutions may be asked to conduct Mock Parliament competition in their institutions. The best teams should be identified for giving suitable prizes. UGC is requested to formulate a plan in consultation with M/o Parliamentary Affairs.
