		augment the quality of faculty and research personnel in the country.				
		Research and development activities are considered as an essential component of higher education				
		because of their role in creating new knowledge and insight and imparting excitement and dynamism				
		to the educational process, as well as make them need based in view of the national requirements.				
	(b)	The objective of this scheme is to create and update the general research capabilities of the faculty				
		members of the various Technical Institutes. The proposal should include a specific project theme				
		with a clear statement of the objectives, details of equipment and other research facilities proposed				
		to be acquired and the expected deliverables from the project.

	(d)	One proposal from one PI (Principal Investigator) will be sanctioned at any point of time within the

	(e)	Maximum number of proposals acceptable per institute (including sanctioned earlier but not				
		completed) shall be five and three from Govt. institute and Pvt. Institute respectively. However,				
		maximum number of proposal acceptable to be approved per institute shall be two for Govt. and Pvt.

1.6 Proc	ssing Methodology:		
(a	The proposal shall be assessed by an expert committee constituted as follows:		
(b	Three member expert committee not below the rank of Associate Professor.		
(c	At least two members among the experts shall be from the concerned stream.		
1.7 Tern	s and conditions:		
(a	The Principal Investigator already having ongoing RPS projects from AICTE shall not be considered unless the ongoing projects are completed.		
(b	The departments of the institute not having relevant Post Graduate Programme intended for execution of the proposed project as well as Diploma level Courses are not eligible for financial assistance under RPS Scheme.		
(c	The Principal Investigator has the primary responsibility for the implementation and completion of the project within the stipulated time period.		
(d	In case the Principal Investigator leaves the Institution without transfer of the project or goes on long leave, the Co- Principal Investigator would be allowed to continue with the project, subject to the consent of the Principal Investigator in case of long leave and approval of AICTE. All such requests should be sent to AICTE in advance. Therefore, association of a Co- Principal Investigator in the project is MUST.		
(e	In case the Principal Investigator and the Co- Principal Investigator leaves the Institute and there is no other associated Co-Investigator to carry out the project, the Head of the Department should take the responsibility for identifying a competent person in the Institution in the relevant subject area and submit his/her bio-data to the Council for further consideration.		
(f	The date of receipt of the grant by Institute shall be taken as the date of commencement of the project. The Registrar/Director/Principal of the Institute shall intimate receipt of the grant to AICTE. If the Institute/ PI do not take-up the project work within 6 months of the receipt of the grant, approval shall ipso facto lapse and the Institute shall become liable to refund the entire grant along with interest generated to AICTE.		
(g	The grant will be utilized strictly for the purpose as specified in the sanction letter. Re-appropriation of funds from Recurring to Non-Recurring is allowed but not vice versa ; Non-Recurring and Recurring heads are 75% and 25% respectively of the total grant, unless otherwise recommended by AICTE experts. The list of equipment decided by the experts is final and there can be no changes later on.		

(h) in vice versa restricted to sanctioned cost. Excess cost shall be met by the Institute from its or resources. The recurring grant can be utilized for the items sanctioned by the AICTE. This should not be use for travel abroad to attend Conference / seminars. However, for presenting a Paper in a Seminar Conference within the country, the travel expenses may be met from the recurring grant. Furth expenditure incurred towards hiring of staff on contract basis shall be considered only if the sa was recommended by the Experts and approved by AICTE. No budget be utilized for hiring permanent staff. Interest accrued on the sanctioned grant-in-aid will be reported and refunded back to AIC and not adjusted against the subsequent second instalment. (E)	Research Promotion Scheme for Rural Area (RPS-Rural)
(i)	Objective:
	The higher education in particular technical education in Rural areas is not upto the standard
	compared with other institutes in urban areas of the country. The problem is due to poor
	infrastructure and lack of equipment etc. for research work and struggling institutes are not getting
	grants. In order to extend the benefit of RPS to the institute specially situated in rural areas of the
	country (Z category) with the relaxation criteria.
(ii)	Eligibility:
(a)	Proposals would be invited from the institutions located in Z categories cities as per Ministry of
	Finance OM No.2/5/2017-E.II (B) dated 07.07.2017.
(b)	Qualifying criteria be reduced to 50% marks as average of all the 3 evaluators
(c)	Other eligibility criteria remain same as per the existing RPS Scheme
